CHRISTMAS FROM THE HOLY LAND

Having just returned from a trip to the Holy Land, I'm sure you expected it would somehow find its way into this article. The trip was amazing in so many ways. After reading the Bible since a child, walking in the places Jesus walked, and traveling through the regions mentioned in those pages, expanded my view of the Scriptures.

Whether it was standing on a boat in the middle of the Sea of Galilee, tasting of the water from Jacob's Well (John 4), scanning the beauty of Jerusalem while standing high on the Mount of Olives, or walking through the Garden of Gethsemane, each day was filled with opportunities to add dimensions to the pages of the Gospels. To stand beside an olive tree which was there at the time when Jesus entered the Garden to pray, is a humbling thing indeed.

One of the leaders of this trip told the story of taking his granddaughter to the Holy Land two years ago. He said he and his wife weren't sure what this teen would think about her time there. But the comment she made rings true to my heart. Nightly she explored the places they'd visit the next day and in summary she said, "Grandpa, it's all real."

I think there's a place in the back of our mind which distances us from the pages of the Holy Scriptures by more than just time and miles on a plane. Perhaps we wonder if the land of the Bible isn't something like the Middle Earth of Tolkien's classic, the Lord of the Rings. But this is real. The Sea of Galilee is real. The town of Nazareth is real. The City of Jerusalem is real. The Mount of Olives and the Garden of Gethsemane is real. Christ's coming to walk among us is real. He entered a real place at a real time and face our very real dilemma of sin and life in a broken world

Entering the Advent and Christmas season right on the heels of this trip to the Holy Land will give me even more passion as we listen to the announcement of Gabriel, the song of Mary, and the choir of angels announcing "news of great joy for all the people for Christ the Savior is born." It's all real. Come join in the celebration.



Dear St. John's Family and Friends,

Today I want us to examine why Godly stewardship should be important for us. Many people have a misunderstanding of what it means to be a steward. It's not just getting out of debt and sticking to a budget. It's much more than just writing a tithe check every month. Living as a steward means surrendering your finances to God and recognizing yourself as a *manager*, not owner, of all you have. It is a part of our identity, not just our behavior.



I want to share with you a few of the biblical principles of stewardship and four reasons why becoming God's steward is so very important, all taken from Matthew 25:14-30 – The Parable of the Talents. If you're not familiar with the Parable of the Talents, I'd encourage you to go read it. The story is of three people who all work for the same master.

The master leaves on a journey but entrusts different amounts of silver to each of the three men before he departs. He distributes the silver based on each man's ability. The first man receives five bags of silver, the second, two bags, and the third, one bag. While the master is gone, the first and second men invest their silver, multiplying the amount they were given to profit their master. The third man, however, goes and buries his silver. When the master returns, the first two men give back double the amount of silver they were given. The third man gives back exactly what he was given.

As you might guess, the master is pleased with the work and faithfulness of the first two men – they're rewarded. The third man is called wicked, lazy, and worthless. He loses his job, was punished, and cast out of the master's presence.

In the Parable of the Talents, the money that was entrusted to each person was not theirs. The money was given to them for a certain amount of time and they were held accountable for their management of it.

It's a perfect example of how God entrusts us with money, property or other things of value during our time here on earth. We will be held accountable for how we have managed it, whether we have a lot or a little! We are not the owners of what we have. We are all temporary managers. We will be either faithful or unfaithful in how we manage it. Stewardship is not ordering your finances in a way that you can spend whatever you want. It's ordering your life in such a way that you are responsive to the opportunities to serve, give or invest as the Lord directs. Think about this: In a few years, everything you have will either be thrown away or belong to someone else. Everything. Your house, your car, all your clothing, your money, your most prized possessions. So instead of concerning yourself with the material things of this world, it would be better and more profitable for you to use your money and your time for the Lord and to focus on eternity.

In the Parable of the Talents, the faithfulness of the servants was measured when the master returned and they were either rewarded or punished based on their management. The same will be true of us when we visit the bema seat of heaven.

We only spend a few years here on earth, maybe 60 or 80 years, perhaps a little longer, but we will spend an eternity in heaven. All that we have here has been given to us by God (even if we think we "earned" it, it was God that gave us the skills and opportunity to earn it) and the way we manage what we have been given matters not just now, but more so in heaven. There will be those who multiplied what was given to them and are commended for their good work. They were the ones that used the resources given to them to help and bless others. Then there will be others that did not help and bless others. They are the ones Paul wrote about in First Timothy 5:8, where Paul wrote: "But if anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for members of his household, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever." As you make short-term and long-term plans, think of your family's future needs. Save for retirement, education, and plan your legacy. Learn to be more generous and less selfish.

Heaven is not a celestial vacation or fishing over the edge of a cloud. It is serving the Creator. The stewards that are faithful on Earth will be rewarded with being in charge of cities in Heaven! There, we will continue to work and serve as stewards of the Lord Almighty.



Celebrating Progress: Our "Re new ed" Mission

Every organization benefits from a well-constructed and easily recalled mission statement that provides clarity for their employees. A mission statement reflects an organization's most fundamental purpose for existing. It should be talked about always, hung in every office, classroom, and work space, and be at the center for organizational decision-making. In my short time at St. John, I realized that the previous long-standing mission statement of the school was a bit out of date and did not clearly reflect the fundamental purposes of the school. With that said, it led us to construct what I like to call a "Re new ed Mission Statement". After all, we are not radically altering what we have done pretty well for over 50 years, we are simply refining and refocusing our purpose using a new statement for our current staff and families. The resulting process ended with 10 words (yes, counting the hyphenated word as only one word), that we believe powerfully captures what St. John Lutheran School's purpose for keeping its doors open in Ocala, Florida.

"Pursuing academic excellence ..." describes our primary desire as a school to offer the best academic experience possible for all of our students. This premise has already directed us to implement a new student assessment tool called the "MAP" and has us already considering more effective structural changes for next year that would continue to improve student learning. The vehicle in which we communicate academic excellence is "through the relational impact" of our faculty and staff. It involves our faculty and staff investing in our students relationally beyond just a traditional teacher-student transactional relationship. At St. John Lutheran School, we seek to make a relational impact on every student that is transformative in nature. How can this teacher-student relationship move beyond the transactional to the transformative? This occurs when you couple faith and learning together in an environment that embraces one "of Christ-centered learning." These are the simple, but powerful words that we have chosen to define our "re new ed" mission with our students and families, both now, and into the future for St. John Lutheran School.



Therefore, please save this document to your home computer so you can refer to it when trying to communicate with other members of our church family.

Finally, we will continue to update and share as the updated information comes in, at least once a quarter throughout the calendar year.
